

I have a varied and complex background as a Christian. I was baptized Baptist, confirmed Episcopalian, and ordained Methodist. At one point, I served a Presbyterian church. This history has made me who I am. It gives me rich traditions to pull from and I am glad for the experiences.

When I found the United Methodist Church, I found a home. We have beautiful traditions with liturgies and rites, and yet we're focused (when we are at our best) on bringing the lost to Christ. Our identity is tied to a Church of England priest from the 18th century who felt the most important thing we should do is to offer the world Jesus Christ.

John Wesley had a bit of an identity crisis at times. He was banned from many of the churches in England including the one he grew up in. His response was to stand on his father's grave and preach outside the church. His services often included ecstatic expressions of falling out and wailing. Wesley himself would receive communion several times a day on Sunday. He knew the service times around London and would make a circuit of 6-7 churches to receive the Lord's Supper.

Wesley was able to reconcile his various understandings and although it was never his intention, formed a new expression of the Christian faith. He reformed himself. He is quoted to say, "Light yourself on fire with passion and people will come from miles to watch you burn."

Karl Barth, the 19th century theologian (citing St. Augustine) wrote that the church must always be reformed. Into what? **That** is always the right question to ask and not, must we?

The church carries a lot of baggage with us from other times and other places. It carries the burdens of discrimination, self-focus, and lack of concern for the last, the lost, and the least. Our attention has been on preservation of tradition rather than the mission of the church which is making disciples of Jesus Christ.

If the Christian church is to survive, we must be the church that adapts to the times, reforming itself into a model which makes current generations want what we have. Change is always difficult. It was difficult in Wesley's day; it was difficult in Jesus' day and it will be difficult today. But following those difficult reformations, the church didn't just survive, it thrived.

Our focal point must be on growing the present kingdom by leading people to the saving knowledge of Jesus Christ with the hope that one day, Christ Himself will say, "Well done, my good and faithful servants." Keep safe and healthy.

Trustee News

- -- The Trustees are still hoping to install the new carpet before Christmas, but due to closures for COVID-19, the price went up by \$686.00, to \$6750.00. As of Oct 1st, there was \$4200.00 in the **Sanctuary Remodeling fund**, so we are asking for help in raising the remaining \$2550.00. If every family could give an additional \$51.00, we could make this happen!
- -- Several trees will be trimmed, and/or removed, over the next few months, at both the Church and Parsonage. The trees to be removed are being done because their roots are going beneath the building, or they are dying, or dead. Trimming others to get them away from the building, windows and gutters. If you wish to donate funds to the **Groundskeeping fund**, that would be appreciated.
- -- In the near future, several buckets of mulch will be needed, and several folks, with wheel barrows and rakes, to help distribute the mulch around the 2 properties would be helpful, too. While you thin out your gardens in preparation for Spring, if you have bulbs, or rhizomes you would like to donate, (or you can purchase new for donation) late November, early December would be a "last chance" time to plant for Spring & Summer blossoms. A work day will be announced soon, but we're considering at Nov. 28th or December 5th. Contact Nancy Thrasher, before Nov. 22nd, if you would like to help.
- -- A few construction projects have been named, and bids submitted. If you would like to make donations to our **Building Repair fund**, it will help to pay for some long neglected projects, and those projects that have appeared during our close down. When thinking of giving money as a memorial, or an honorarium, please consider giving to these 3 funds.

Finance News

Thank you for your continued financial support to the church. Your support means we can pay our bills and salaries so that we can continue to function soundly during and after quarantine times. However, as you can see from the report below, we need your continued financial support.

We received \$14,222.00 in September and had expenditures of \$17,468.47 for a \$3,246.47 shortfall. For the year through September 30, we have a shortfall of \$23,525.34. October figures are incomplete as of this date.

We are working on the 2021 budget and hope to reduce the budget considering current COVID conditions and the effect it may have in the future.
