



The following shows the amount of money we have received and our expenditures through July as well as year-to-date figures.

We received \$13,090 in July and spent \$22,606 for a shortage of \$9,516. Please note that we had 3 payroll periods in July which raised expenditures. Year to date, we have received \$120,824 and spent \$141,008 for a year-to-date deficit of **\$20,184.00**
