The tree was always fresh cut Frasier Fir that smelled like pine sap. My sister, myself, and two cousins spent the evening finding something to do, but without exception always received a warning about the ruler my grandmother kept in a kitchen drawer. I never saw it used. The threat was enough to keep us in line.

At bed time, we would settle into pallets or cots wherever they could be placed. Of course, at least one adult slept in the living room with the tree in case we dared to go foraging during the night. The next morning the first one awake did all they could to discretely wake the other kids who would make enough noise to wake everyone else.

I'm sure you can imagine the rest of the day which was filled with presents, food, football. While Jesus wasn't talked about, looking back I know that He was there. In our family, he was like Paul's statue to the unknown God in Athens. Looking back, I'm thankful that the truth about Him was revealed to me.


May your holidays and holy-days be full of memories; may you make new ones to cherish; and may the Christ child be at their center!


