Happy New Year!

2023 is here and with it comes the promises of hope, peace, joy, and love. For Christians, these are more than de-

Food Pantry News

Thanks to all of you who have volunteered to work at the Food Pantry. Some have helped load and unload groceries; some have helped bag groceries on the first and third Thursdays of the month; some have been in charge of "crowd control".

Participation in the Food Pantry has increased dramatically in the past few months. Just a few months ago, we were serving about 15 households per week. In November and December, we averaged serving 30 to 40 households per week. We have a lot of hungry people and children in our community. The patrons have particularly welcomed the addition of bread, milk, eggs, lunch meat, and vegetables which we have been offering since August.

We have good news and bad news to report. First the bad news: As you can see, December giving (normally a very high giving month) was down compared to expenses. The result is a \$20,000 + deficit.

December Budget Giving: \$14,693.00 December Expenses: \$30,416.34 December Balance: -\$15,723.34

Year-to-date Giving through December: \$223,276.68 Year-to-date Expenses through December: \$243,913.02 Year-to-date Balance through November: - \$20,639.34

Now the good news: Our financial campaign was a success. Commitments were up over \$27,000 from last year. I think this reflects renewed vigor in the church. I can see the difference and feel the difference in the church atmosphere. There is an excitement in the air!




