During this 12 months, we lost some members due to illness, death, and changes in life stages. A few moved away. Some left because of perceptions of the future of the United Methodist Church. Others just never got back into the "habit". Good habits are sometimes hard to establish. Bad ones seem easy. Regardless, it has changed who we perceive ourselves to be.

Let's think about the good habit of church. First, there has to be some benefit. A sense of community, feeling good or becoming better people, opportunities for leadership and participation, a sense of belonging and being wanted. I think those attributes are very descriptive of our church. And then there has to be core values that we share. The need to serve one another and those around us. Those opportunities abound.

Regardless of why church has moved down some list of priorities, I encourage you to rethink coming and being a part of the best thing happening in Clinton Tennessee!

Let us not give up the habit of meeting together, as some are doing. Instead, let us encourage one another all the more, since you see that the Day of the Lord is coming nearer. Hebrews 10:25 GNT

INMATES REQUEST BOOKS - SOFT BACK BOOKS ONLY, NO STAPLES,

NO EXPLICIT SEX OR VIOLENCE.

The books can be fiction, biographies, autobiography, how-to books, Bible Study, Christian living, sports, animals. When we think of Outreach in our church, our thoughts go to all of the needs in the community; some are difficult to meet for many reasons. But others require little time. These resources are at our fingertips and in our homes -BOOKS. The inmates in the Anderson County are fathers, mothers, children, grandchildren, brothers, sisters, nieces, nephews and friends of many of us, but they have made poor choices that have put them in Jail. As women discussed in our worship in the jail this past Thursday, several are thankful that they are in jail. They stated jail is giving them an opportunity to reflect on their lives, give them structure, and helping them face what they want to do with the rest of their lives. They are scared: scared of the lethal drugs on the street, scared of losing their children, scared because they are alone from broken relationships and trust, scared of an unknown future. They are also bored in jail and an idle mind is the Devil's workshop. Inmates in the women's worship service asked me specifically to help get a new supply of books in the Detention Center. Director of Alternative Programs, Lucretia Logan, strongly urged us to help meet this need, for both men and women. There is a box in the sanctuary when you can leave books. I will take them to jail. Hopefully this will be an ongoing outreach for our church. Thank you for all of your outreach support. Nancy Large.

Saturday, we got up early and enjoyed a buffet breakfast at Reagan's Pancake House and watched the sunrise as we walked back to LeConte Center for Session 2. We got there early enough to visit the prayer room and the retail shops set up for the conference. There was a special offering for a tribe in Peru called Kakataino which raised over \$6000.00 to have the New Testament translated in their own language.

Rev. Dr. Hand spoke on John 6:1-16. The band shoed up again and I was told by a youth "wow, everyday her talks grow greater". After session 2 we went shopping and the HS students attempted to make pizzas from scratch. More shopping at the Island and then dinner at Bennet's Barbeque

Saturday night's session (#3) was on John 14:1-14 was so inspirational that half of the Bee-Attitudes went forward during the altar call. I know they will need prayers; they are all great students and we look forward to seeing if this choice will bring them closer to God. Afterwards, most of us did mud facials and hung out doing crafts.

Sunday morning it was raining until it was time to go to session 4. Verse John 14:12 started off and the whole room was singing "Sanctuary". After Communion the band started and was back to it. We had lunch at Frizzles Chicken and back home to share our wonderful experiences. Jenny Nichol


